The Third Circuit Court of Appeals Library is currently accepting applications for a temporary Assistant Librarian.

Position Title: Assistant Librarian (#05-23-USCA3LIB)
Location: Library of the U.S. Courts
Salary Range: CL 27 (\$29.00 per hour)
Position Type: Temporary appointment; full time until July 28, 2023
Start Date: May 22, 2023 – open until filled

Position Overview: The assistant librarian will be expected to work under the supervision of the Manager of Research Services to support the mission of the Third Circuit Libraries. The primary responsibilities include assisting librarians with research-related projects and day-to-day library functions such as research and reference service as needed; creating and updating research guides; creating bibliographies; digital archives work; oral history transcriptions; photocopying; and scanning. Other duties and responsibilities may be assigned as needed.

Requirements:

- Master's degree in library science (MLS) from an ALA accredited school of library or information science
- Working knowledge of various online databases
- Experience in word processing and spreadsheet programs
- Ability to work in a team-oriented service environment
- Strong attention to detail to ensure accuracy and consistency
- Strong computer skills in a Windows computing environment, including Office365 applications (especially Excel, Word, Outlook, and Teams)

Preferred Qualifications:

- Prior experience in a library environment
